Kumarghat Fishery Department



The role played by fishery department of kumarghat, Unakoti tripura towards meeting the food security of the state's population is significant, as fish is an important constituent of daily diet of more than 95 percent of its population. The department is doing all out an effort to implement and promote various developmental scheme for common people.



Kumarghat Fishery Department was established in the year 1980. It is situated near Kumarghat Bhabotarini Mandir. It has an area of 5000 sq. meters. There are 60 government workers working in the department. Among them nine are assistant workers and one head officer of the department. There are more than 50 varieties of fishes found in the



fishery. Those are **Catla, Mrigal, Rohu**, and some minor carps are **Reba, Bata, Fringe lipped carp, Calbasu and Pengba**. Some more exotic carps are **Common carp, Amur common carp, grass carp and silver carp**. We can also get some live fishes which are marketed live and fetch higher price such as **magur, cat fish, fresh water shark** and many more. This fish is bred very carefully in a separate place which are done by the workers. This fishery helps local people to meet their necessity every day.



We know that fish is called the **Brain Food** as it helps in development and function of brain and Heart food as it contributes to lower rate of heart attack and strokes. Consumption of fish reduces the risk of autoimmune diseases like diabetes, improve sleep quality. Hence all together we conclude that kumarghat fishery department plays an important role in lives of the people around.

Future Goals:

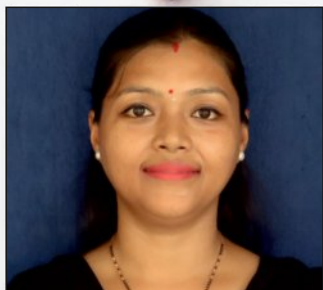

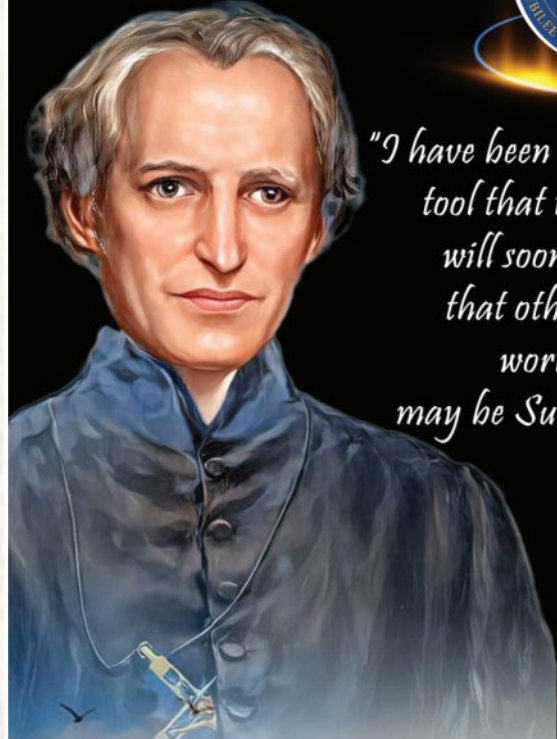
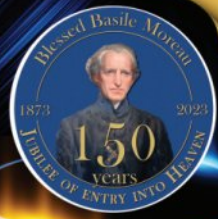
