Dear Readers,

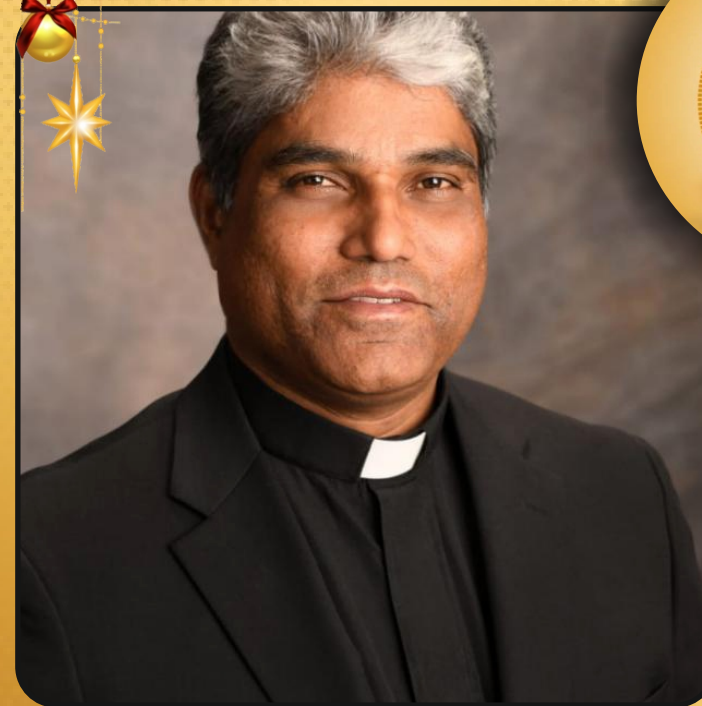

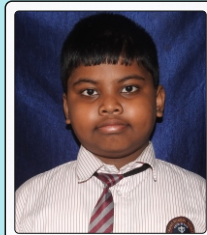
If we meet each other outside the school we wish them, they also communicate with us through whatsapp groups, meet etc.

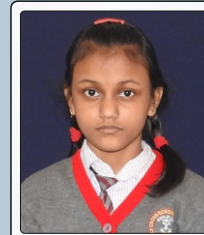

We can say that having teachers like those in our school, as a mentor can improve the social and emotional growth of all students in our school.

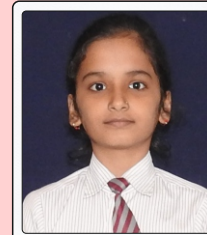

For me, my teachers are the best teachers in the world.

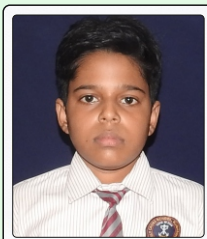

God bless Holy Cross School, Pabiacherra, Kumarghat.



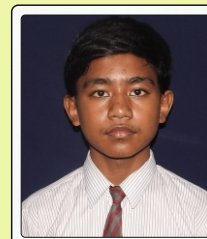

It can be concluded that due to strong student-teacher relationship, there is a positive classroom environment and experience and foster a welcoming environment and produce success for both the students and the teachers.

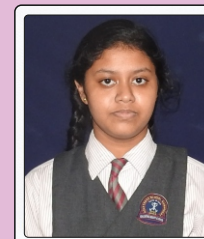

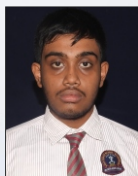

This competition was basically divided into two groups. Group 'A' (5th, 6th, & 7th standard students) and Group 'B' (8th, 9th, & 10th standard students).

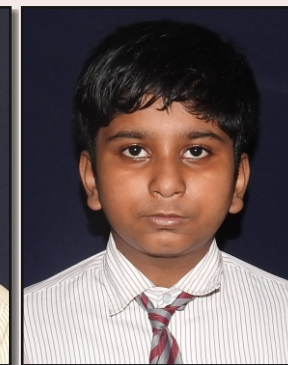

The demonstrations included the switching on of the fire alarm in the function of the smoke detectors and how to use the extinguisher attached near the main electrical points. Also, how to open the nozzles of the cylinder sprayers were shown. The teachers were also trained how to use the fire safety pipes attached outside the building, how to unroll it and how to spray at minor burns. Last but not the least the use of the main hose pipes that is used during the major fire accident was demonstrated, starting right from the opening of the kit with a key or even using the emergency breakable glass doors how to open the pipes and shift to the controls to which the fire brigade is attached during the times of emergency. With the help of all the teachers of the fire and safety Committee, Mr Prashant demonstrated the process on how to spray water through the main hose pipe. Also, to ensure proper supply of water and to cut off water storage, the process of turning on the water pump was shown with the help of the school caretaker.

On 10th November 2022, Fire Safety Personnel from Kumarghat Fire Station under the leadership of LFM. Bennubusan Debnath, came to our school to give a session on Disaster Management. The main spokesperson for the session was FM. Ashim Saha. Everyone did ably present the session with due explanations and demonstrations like CO2, BA SET, ATP, Rescue measures, and other fire disaster management ways. SCHOOL DISASTER MANAGEMENT (HCSK)

The “National School Safety Programme (NSSP) - a Demonstration Project” is being implemented by National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) in 22 States/UT Governments in a time bound manner. NSSP is a holistic project to promote culture of Safety in Schools and would cover 200 schools in each of the selected 43 districts of the country falling in seismic zones IV & V.

Our state Tripura is also lying in earthquake seismic zone V, where there is a possibility of occurring devastative earthquake of 8 and more magnitude in Richter scale. *School safety management* addresses equity-focused planning for children's health, safety, and well-being for educational continuity in relation to all-hazards and risks to children and staff in the education sector. This includes planning and operationalizing comprehensive all-hazards risk-assessment, risk prevention and reduction, response preparedness, recovery.

According to Framework on School Safety Mock Exercise- Each school is mandated to have a Disaster Management (DM) Plan, mock exercises should be conducted in schools every month, on the perceived disasters. Mock Exercise is one of the important activity under the Project to be conducted in all 8600 identified schools. Our **HOLY CROSS SCHOOL, PABIACHERRA** is also one among them. The state has carried out the targeted mock drills in all identified schools and in extended schools as per mock drill guidelines developed by the

state government. We are continuing mock drills and evacuation drills in the school by involving line agencies like Fire service, Electricity Department, Health Department and NGOs on every 3rd Saturday of every month as per the notification issued by the Director of School Education Department. If the 3rd Saturday is a holiday, the same is being done on 4th Saturday. To test the efficiency and effectiveness of the DM Plan, as also to find gaps, the district authorities and Education department are monitoring the drills and submitting report to the Revenue Department. Miss. Anima Debbarma, RedR/UNICEF India, visited our school on 11th November 2022. During the visit, Miss. Anima Debbarma was accompanied by Inspector of School, Kumarghat Subdivision. She explained the purpose of Disaster Management (DM) Plan, had discussions with different committees and also interacted with students and parents. She highly appreciated the works and responsibilities carried out by our Disaster Management Team. She also appreciated all the committees for their dedication and the efforts they put for being alert and active in their responsibilities to spread awareness about how we can save ourselves from these disasters.

On 26th November, 2022, in the presence of Sri Prasanta Kilikdar, the District Education Officer of Unakoti District, we had observance of Constitution Day by reading of preamble with the Staff and Students.

Exam Cell Report

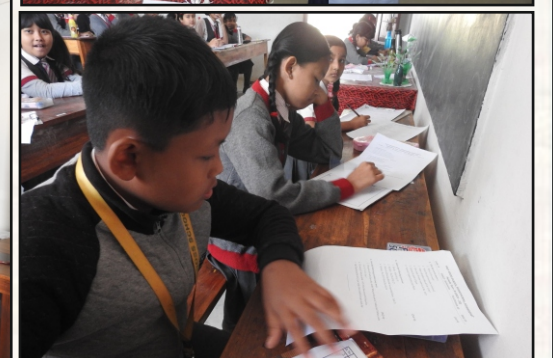
Examination evaluates the students' ability of learning. It is an effective way to analyze the knowledge of students. Exam is the most important part of developing the students' intellectual and help them gain more knowledge. Holy Cross School Kumarghat conducts four exams in every session. In this session (2022-23) also four exams will be conducted. Nursery to class VIII will have PT-I, Half-yearly, PT-II and Annual exam. Classes IX and X will have PT-I, PT-II, PT-III and final exam. For class X, one or two Pre- Board Exams also will be conducted before the Board Exam, in order to prepare them and keep them ready for the Board Exam.

PT-I Exam for classes Nursery to class-X was conducted from 13th June to 18th June 2022 and the result of PT-I was declared on 5th August, 2022. Half Yearly Exam for classes Nursery to class - VIII and PT-II Exam for classes IX and X was conducted from 19th September to 29th September, 2022 and the result was declared on 29th October, 2022 and the PT-II Exam for Classes Nursery to VIII and PT-III for Classes IX & X was conducted from 12th December to 17th December, 2022 and the result will be given on 21st January 2023.

All the processing works for PT-I and Half -Yearly Exams were carried out by the Exam committee with the help of the faculty members. Exam Committee is a body which is authorized by the Principal to conduct examinations and make policy decisions with regard to organizing and holding examinations, improving system of examinations, seating arrangements and also preparing the schedule of examinations. Exam Committee deals with all the matters with relation to any kinds of examination.

Exam Committee conducts Pre-Exam meeting along with the headmistress with regard to smooth conducting of examinations, submission of Question Papers, Invigilation Duty Chart, seating plan, attendance record, evaluation of answer sheets, preparing Report Card and declaration of result. During the meeting, the Exam Committee makes sure that all stationeries like exam papers, drawing sheet, graphs, maps, threads etc are available. Exam Committee sees that the timetable of the Exam Schedule provided by Holy Cross Education Foundation (HCEF) is excuted. Subject teachers prepares two sets of question paper for each exam. First Pre-Board exam will be conducted from 16/01/2023 to 29/01/2023 for class- X.

Exams are conducted to assess the performance of the students in between the session. It is based on a combination of theory exam, internal assessment and practical assessment. The goal of every exam is to evaluate the students. We show the answer sheet of primary and pre primary students to their parents and higher classes answer sheet to the students in the class. Report card for every exam is given to the parents. After every exam, exam committee submits a report to the principal. Exam committee keeps the records of each issue related to the examination.



SPORTS: GENERAL FITNESS ACTIVITIES

The most important aim and objective of Health and Physical Education is to make an individual physically fit and mentally strong. Exercises and games & sports are the only way to make a person physically fit and mentally sound. One cannot be a successful person in life without physical fitness. Physical fitness is the first condition of a successful life. On that point of view and suitable weather, we have classes on the basis of general physical fitness activities, not only the theory but also practical. The components of physical fitness are as follows:-

1. Strength- It is the ability of a person of the muscles to overcome resistance.
2. Speed - it means the ability to move the body as fast as possible, especially in running.
3. Endurance - this is the ability to sustain an activity long time.
4. Flexibility - it refers to the range of movements of joints.
5. Coordination - coordinative abilities mainly depend on the central nervous system.

Our accuracy, rhythm, flow and constancy depend on our coordinative abilities. Certainly, exercise is the excellent way to improve our fitness and health. Games and sports improve the functioning of circulatory system, digestive system, respiratory system and excretory systems which results in better muscular co-ordination.

Besides theory classes, practical activities are also carried on smoothly in our school. The students should learn discipline and they should have the knowledge of attention and stand at ease position, making line and file, free hand exercises, various minor group games, major group games etc. The basic rules of warm up exercises are such as:-

1. Exercises must be easy to complex
2. Either top to bottom or bottom to top.
3. Clockwise and anti-clockwise rotation.
4. According to need, capacity, age of the students and weather of the day etc

In accordance with the importance of physical fitness cited above, Holy Cross School, Pabiacherra, Kumarghat stressed on many exercises, games, related to physical fitness for the small children and minor games for the primary classes are being conducted during the games periods. We also conduct major games like football, volleyball, Kabbadi, Throwball etc. From 8th January 2023 to 12th January 2023, we will be having Annual Cultural and Sports which includes different games and sports for different categories of students.

And it was a wonderful experience and joyful moment that Holy Cross School, Kumarghat participated in Bro. Joy Memorial Volleyball Tournament (Boys) and Bro.
